Minutes of the November Session, 1924 of the Municipal Council of the County of Simcoe.

First day

Council Chamber, Barrie
November 24th 1924.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment at the June Session.

The Warden in the Chair.

All the members present.

The Minutes of the Last Meeting of the June Session having been printed and distributed, were taken as read.

The Warden addressed the Members and expressed his pleasure at again meeting the Council in Session.

He referred to the prosperity of the Province as represented by the good crop harvested this year as the Statistics show that the average for the past three years to be the greatest in the Province's History.

He mentioned the fact that there had been no litigation of any kind during the year.

Considerable honour had been brought to the Country. West Brothers of Thornton having secured first honours for their honey in the competition in England.

The Boys Pig Club in North and South Simcoe were successful in winning first and second prize for a car of select hogs at the Union Stock yards at Toronto in the competition with nine car-loads and the judging team, composed of members of these Clubs, was awarded second prize for the North Simcoe team and the fourth prize for the South Simcoe team.

These successes will awaken interest in important industries.

The visit of the Highway Commission and the information they obtained in their tour of the Counties would no doubt be for the betterment of the Roads and make changes in the Highway Act.

He reported the reforestry plantation as being in good shape.

The County had lost through death some of her prominent men, Joseph Pierson an Ex-Reeve of Tecumseth and at one time an able member of the County Council. A.W. Beardsley, the County Messenger, had been called by death since the June Sessions. He was one of the best known men around the County buildings having been born in the Court House. The County never had a more devoted servant than the late Alfred Beardsley.
