The Clerk called the Council to order, and requested that they elect one from among their number to be Warden of the County for the year 1930.

The Clerk appointed Councillors Spicher and Larose to act as scrutineers, and declared the nominations open for the position of Warden for the year 1930.

All the nominees with the consent of their movers and seconders having withdrawn excepting Councillors Glover and Creswicke, the Clerk proceeded to take the vote, and Councillor Creswicke, Reeve of the Town of Barrie, receiving the votes of the majority of the members present, the Clerk declared him duly elected Warden for the year 1930.

His Honour, Judge Wismer, held special court and administered the oath of office to the Warden elect.

Judge Wismer asked the representatives of the Ministerial Association of the Town of Barrie to open the proceedings of the Session.

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The Rev. Mr. Short, the President of the Association, stated that it was quite fitting and proper for the Ministerial Association to be present, thereby linking up the secular and religious activities of the County. He ~~stated~~<sup>believed</sup> that all public business should be conducted as in the sight of God, and he congratulated Mr. Creswicke on his election and stated that from his association with him he found him to be a good type of man and a good sport, either in winning or losing.

He was glad to be present as representative of the Ministerial Association and wished the Council a full measure of prosperity during the year.

The Rev. Mr. Walls invoked the Divine blessing.

His Honour, Judge Wismer, congratulated the Warden on his election. He had watched him from a boy and also during recent years as a lawyer, and found him very attentive and painstaking in his profession.

He referred to increasing expenditure in Education and Roads, and cautioned against too high increases in these lines. With reference to expenses in connection with charitable purposes they were increasing, and he instanced Mothers' Allowances, House of Refuge, and the Children's Shelter, and to these were added the Old Age Pensions for this year.

He thought it was a good thing to have proceedings opened by representatives of the Ministerial Association, and contrasted it with other Countries, such as Russia, where the name of God was not allowed to be spoken.

He referred to the death of Judge Ross, who officiated last year and who had been a conscientious and able Judge.

He wished the Council a happy and prosperous year.

Moved by Councillor Crawford, and seconded by Councillor Downey, and ordered.

That a vote of thanks be tendered to his Honour, Judge Wismer for his presence here, this afternoon, to administer the oath of office to the Warden and for his instructive address, also to the Ministerial Association of Barrie for their services this afternoon through their representatives, the Rev. Mr. Shortt, and the Rev. Mr. Wall, in connection with the opening of this Council.

The Warden then took the Chair.

The Minutes of the last Meeting of the November Session having been printed and distributed, were taken as read.

The Warden invited Ex-Wardens Woods, Carter, Coombs, Banting, Eplett and Gatrix, and Mayor McCuaig of the Town of Barrie, to seats on the dias.

Ex-Warden Woods congratulated the Warden on his election, and stated the position of Warden was usually given as reward for services rendered the County which he was sure was the case of Warden Creswicke, and that he would serve the County to the best of his ability.

Ex-Wardens Coombs, Carter, Eplett, Banting and Gatrix also briefly addressed the Council.

Mayor McCuaig stated he was closely associated with the Warden for the past three years, and if he served the County with the same attention and ability as he had given the Town, the Council would have no regrets.

He congratulated the Warden on his election, particularly as he was bringing the honour to the Town of which he was the Mayor.

He was glad the new Registry Office was to be opened, as more space for the filing of records and documents was long overdue.

The Warden thanked the Members for electing him warden, and stated that would give his best endeavours in the interest of the County, and asked for their co-operation during the year. He was thankful to his Honour Judge Wismer, and the representatives of the Ministerial Association for their presence here this afternoon.

He referred to the death of Judge Ross, which was a distinct loss to the whole County.

He was glad that the new Registry Office would be officially opened this afternoon. The unveiling of the plate would be performed by Mr. Charles Gratrix, last year's Warden, during whose regime the office was built. And he asked that after adjournment the Members would all proceed to the Registry Office for the ceremony.

He referred to the matter of dogs killing sheep in the Townships of the County, which was increasing rather than diminishing. He suggested that rewards be offered by Townships for the killing of dogs caught worrying or killing sheep.

He referred to the barberry bush and the importance of having all plants and hedges destroyed.

He spoke of the short agricultural courses held at Stayner and Lafontaine, which were well attended in each place.

In reference to the potato industry. He stated the County was making rapid strides in the improvement in growing and marketing of better potatoes.

Encouragement to stock judging for boys was giving good results, and it should be continued.

Mr. McCuaig, representing the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, addressed the Council, and asked for a grant to the Institute for 1930, to assist in it's work.

Mr. J.E.Jamieson M.P. South West Simcoe, being in the chamber, the Warden asked him to a seat on the dias.

He would suggest that the Council memorialized the Highway Department to assume the whole cost of the Provincial Highways.

The special grants given to Stayner and Coldwater helped to increase the expenditure charged against the County Road System. It was a matter for the Council to consider.

He expressed the hope that the Members of the Council would assist in seeing that Hospital accounts were paid promptly, and that notices of indigent patients would be acknowledged within the statutory time.

Mr. Coleman presented a photograph of Ex-Warden Charles H. Eplett, Coldwater, to be hung in the Council Chamber.

The Warden invited all the Members and officials to the banquet at the American Hotel at 7 o'clock this evening.
