The Warden, on addressing the Members, welcomed them to the Session, and he knew that harmony and good fellowship would exist between them all, on transacting the business on hand.

He was very pleased to report good crop conditions wherever he had been through the County, and the prospects were very satisfactory for a good harvest which he hoped would ensure a bounteous return to the farmers for their labours.

He reported that the Atherley Bridge affairs were now settled, A cheque for \$30,456.58 having been received from Ontario County.

And also, a cheque for \$110,945.95 had been received from the Department of Highways in regard to the Good Roads Subsidy for the year 1929.

He had visited the Nancy Committee, at one of their Meetings, and would report later regarding this matter.

He referred to the Grand Jury Report and the credit reflected on the County Buildings and the officials in charge of same. The completion of the new Registry Office was one which would fulfill the needs of the County for very many years to come, and hoped the Councillors would make a point of inspecting the same.

He regretted very much to hear of the bereavement suffered by Thomas McKnight, of Cooks-Town, in the loss of his wife, and he knew that the sympathy of the Members would be sent to him in the proper way.

He referred to the opening of the traffic on the new pavement at Port McNicoll, and on behalf of Councillor Fenton, extended an invitation to all the Members of the County Council and the Officials, to be present tomorrow evening, Tuesday, June 17th, at the official opening. Also, an invitation from the Governor and Mrs Jardine to attend supper and a social evening, commencing at 6.30 o'clock, at the House of Refuge, Beeton, on Thursday evening. And also, an invitation to attend the graduation exercises of the Royal Victoria Hospital, in the Collegiate Auditorium, Barrie, at 8.P.M. on Thursday. And he further invited the Members, Officials, their wives and sweethearts to attend the Warden's Outing to be held at the Orchard Point Inn, Atherley, on Wednesday afternoon, commencing at 2.30 o'clock, followed by a banquet at 6.30.

He was very pleased to hear that Mrs D.H. Coleman was out of the Hospital, and hoped that soon she would be quite recovered.



The Council met according to the adjournment.

The Warden in the Chair.

All the Members present except Councillor Potter.

The Minutes of the last Session were read and adopted.

The Warden presented the following communications,

From D.R.O'Gormen, Toronto, re- the purchase of a portion of Lot 16. Con.3. Tay Township.

Request from the officials of the Town of Alliston to guarantee certain debentures of the said Town.

The Warden stated that there were two or three Deputations, who had matters of importance to bring before the Council.

Councillor Doyle introduced a deputation from the Simcoe Foresters.

Colonel C.K.S. MacDonell O.C. the Simcoe Foresters addressed the Council, on behalf of the Regiment, and mentioned it's achievements and stated that the Regiment required new Colours. The Colours represent the soul of the Regiment and stand not only for the dignity of the Regiment but for the whole County of Simcoe.

Alex. Cowan, a past Commanding officer of the Regiment, addressed the Council and stated that the Simcoe Foresters was considered the best rural Regiment in the Province.

The Colours were the flags of the regiment, and the honours won by it would be attached to the Colours.

He referred to the Honours won during the North West Rebellion and later during the Great War.

The Regiment was provided with new colours about twenty one years ago. They are now the old colours and they were asking the County to provide new ones.

He was confident the Council would be willing to do this.

The Honourable William Finlayson, Minister of Lands and Forests, stated that he appeared before the Council just fifteen years previous to this time on a similar mission, but the difference was he at that time was asking for men to join the colours.

This County recruited two regiments during the war and was the first County in the Province to recruit a full regiment up to strength.

We all hoped there would never be another war but it was unknown when protection might be needed, and it was well to keep the organization intact in case of emergency.

The Colours would last for probably twenty-five years and it would be a recognition for the services of the Regiment, and were much needed.

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Councillor Webb introduced a deputation of ladies from the Churchill Women's Institute. Mrs Orval Todd expressed her appreciation at being allowed to address the Council. The Churchill Women's Institute had given twenty-seven years service, and their first request for assistance was a modest one, and was in the public interest.

The request was for the maintenance of a light at the intersection of the Provincial Highway and the County Road at Churchill. It was to protect traffic and in the interests of public safety. The danger lay in the increased and rapid traffic. The road was dark at this place which added to the dangers of an accident.

The Institute would install the light if the County would provide for it's maintenance.

Councillor Webb introduced a deputation, representing the Simcoe County Bee-Keepers Association.

Mr. Miller stated that they appeared before the Council to ask for better inspection for this industry.

Foul brood attacks the bees in different stages. It is a disease that is hard to kill and is spread by honey from infected hives. Foul brood can be cured but most generally it isn't, and it is hard to distinguish between American and European types. American foul brood cannot be destroyed by the bees, and has to be handled with care, and requires inspection twice a year.

This year \$500.00 had been allotted to this County by the Department, and he hoped that the Council would assist the Association in stamping out the disease.

Mr. McQuire explained that bees were useful in the growing of fruits, apples and clovers, and stated that bees were worth nine times as much to the farmers as the cost of inspection. He asked for a grant to assist the bee-keepers in keeping their colonies clean.

Councillor Lowe, Deputy Reeve of Barrie, introduced a deputation from the Canadian Legion of the British Empire, ^{Service League,} Barrie Post, consisting of Messrs Hill, Burton, and Shuter, and Major Knowles.

Major Knowles stated that they were holding a re-union on August the 11th. Sports in the afternoon and a banquet at night to be addressed by Sir Arthur Currie. In the evening there would be a sham battle. The total cost was estimated at \$1,000.00 and the deputation asked for a grant of \$250.00.

Mr. Shuter stated that the Major had mentioned the important points but the convention was the first County one held up to the present.
