# Rapid Re-Housing





#### RENT ALLOWANCE PROGRAM



Rapid Re-Housing rent allowance program **supports shelter diversion strategies** within the community.



This targeted program focuses on moderate acuity households and individuals who can **quickly exit homelessness** and be resettled into rental accommodations with additional supports.



Through the Rapid Re-Housing Program, supports can include the **rental allowance subsidy**, paid directly to the landlord for up to nine months.



The **goal of the program** is to provide **immediate permanent rental housing** options along with short-term supports to allow for **quick exit from homelessness**.

# Rapid Re-Housing helps with

### **FINDING HOUSING**



Screening, assessment, and assistance with apartment searches and supports.

#### **PAYING FOR HOUSING**



Start-up financial assistance and/or a short-term rental allowance.

## **STAYING HOUSED**



Tenant follow-up services along with landlord outreach/relations.


#### Households by Area

- 13 in Midland




#### Landlords by Area
