QT Youth Connection	The Gilbert Centre for Social and Support Services	QT Youth Connection is a drop-in for queer, transgender, and questioning youth aged 12 to 20 in Simcoe County that provides youth with access to supportive spaces and activities in order to build resilience by reducing social isolation and related mental health impacts. The parenting support is an initiative to address the root of one of the root causes of LGBTQ youth homelessness, the lack of family support.	\$65,000.00
Program Access Grant	Simcoe County Youth Reach	Youth Reach's mission is to have a transformative impact on youths in Simcoe County through recreation, play and sports. They provide opportunities for children and youths living in low income families who cannot afford registration fees to participate in extra curricular activities that support their healthy development.	\$65,000.00
Rx Food	The Karma project Community Food Co-Operative Inc	Rx Food aims to close the good food gap in the North Simcoe area, by increasing the distribution of and access to fresh, healthy, and affordable foods for vulnerable populations. This concept sees health care providers recommending a monthly supply of fresh and healthy fruits and vegetables, as a complement to a patient's regular health care routine.	\$60,000.00
Integration to Canadian Society Program	Bradford Immigrant and Community Services	Providing services that address gaps and settlement needs and best practices for Newcomers and Immigrant adults and children in Simcoe County via online platforms, telephone, email and in person.	\$64,000.00
Reach Out and Touch Someone	Askennonia Senior Centre	To provide one on one supports for seniors (55 plus) with a specific emphasis on vulnerable and marginalized individuals facing increased barriers to navigate health and social systems within their local communities.	\$55,000.00
South Simcoe Peer Support Outreach Program	Lance Krasman Memorial Centre for Community Mental Health	The Peer Support Outreach Program provides peer support to individuals who are experiencing mental health and/or addictions challenges, and are experiencing low income, in areas of South Simcoe. This program will continue to increase access to peer support-based connections to promote recovery, personal growth, and self-determination and will facilitate increased access to basic needs for participants.	\$50,000.00
Simcoe County Food Council	South Georgian Bay Community Health Centre	This position, supporting the Simcoe County Food Council, is community based and works to build awareness of and linkages between food initiatives and programs across the County. Operation Grow	Huronian Transition Homes	Operation Grow is a social enterprise holistically designed to address poverty, food scarcity, food de-skilling, social exclusion and the impacts of trauma for women who have experienced violence. Acting as a community hub, Operation Grow integrates a vertical farm, inspected kitchen, retail space, yoga and mediation studio, meeting rooms and shower and laundry facilities to provide dynamic much needed supports to marginalized women in the North Simcoe Community.	\$100,000.00

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CAPC-Next step program	Simcoe County CAPC c/o Catulpa Community Support Services	The Next Step program addresses child poverty by providing weekly programs across the county to vulnerable low-income parents and their children ages 0-36 months. Participants receive a variety of resources each week, which include grocery gift cards, fresh produce, health information, developmental screening, support and referrals to other services within their community.	\$140,000.00
CAPC-Young Parent Program	Simcoe County CAPC c/o Catulpa Community Support Services	To support vulnerable young parents and their children. The program addresses teen and young parent poverty and related challenges experienced by young parents. The program provides resources and supports to pregnant/parenting teens and young parents across the county.	\$140,000.00
CAPC-Children's programs	Simcoe County CAPC c/o Catulpa Community Support Services	CAPC children's program fills a gap in services for vulnerable families living in poverty by reducing the effects of child poverty by providing quality programming and resources to children age 1 to 6, providing supportive job readiness and employment opportunities to past participants, and low income women, and delivering children's activity kits.	\$30,000.00
Bebminot (Protector of children)	Barrie area Native Advisory Circle (BANAC)	The Bebminot Family Wellness program is committed to developing, supporting and delivering programs will promote the health and well-being of Indigenous children, families and communities or those at risk of experiencing the effects of poverty, in a safe and inclusive environment, and also support the provision of better opportunities for low income families.	\$100,000.00
