

Minutes of October Session 1877

Council Hall Paris 18 Oct 1877

The Council met this day pursuant to adjournment from the June Session. The Warden in the Chair present all members except Messrs. James, Hanmer, Hand, Parkhill, Martin Dunn, Brumfield and Dr. Spokes.

The minutes of the last day of last Session were read and confirmed.

The Warden addressed the Council at considerable length. The Warden presented the following documents which were read, viz: petition of James Sharpe and 88 others praying for the incorporation of Gravenhurst by Mr. Taylor, Commissioner from the President of the Eye and Ear Infirmary of Guelph and of Mr. Bay's Esq., Chairman of Banff Bank of Trustees.

Ordered: That the Warden do name a special committee of seven to take into consideration the petition of James Sharpe & others. Until the incorporation of the village of Gravenhurst. The Warden named Miss Littlejohn, Cunnum Burgess, Jackson Taylor & John Clarke to be such Committee.

Ordered: That the several documents now before the Council be referred to their respective committees.
