Minutes of November session of the Council of the Corporation of the County  
of Simcoe

Council Chamber 15th Nov. 1897

The Council met today pursuant to a adjournment by Notice from  
the Warden from the June session

The Warden in the Chair - All members present

The Minutes of last day of June session were read & confirmed

His Worship addressed the Council at considerable length in  
historical free and eloquent manner, congratulating the Members  
on their healthy appearance and prompt attendance to the call  
of duty, and spoke very confidently of the sound financial  
standing of the County notwithstanding the unfortunate  
defects of the late Treasurer, and showed that the whole  
County's indebtedness was about \$60,000 which was increased  
since June about ~~\$10,000~~<sup>some</sup> for schools, Roads & Bridges and legal  
Costs, and in a very satisfactory manner outlined the business  
that would claim their attention during the session, instance

amongst the most prominent the appointment of a Treasurer,  
the selection of a site for a House of Refuge and the  
consideration of the advisability of issuing Debentures for  
the present indebtedness or to borrow by note, the address  
met with a warm response from the Members
