

*Council Chamber Barrie*  
January 26<sup>th</sup> 1909

The Council met in accordance and pursuant to Statute  
All members having filed their certificate of election the Clerk called the  
Council to order and requested them to elect a Warden for the ensuing year  
The Clerk appointed Councillors Morris and Simpson as Scrutineers  
The Clerk then declared the nomination for Warden for the year 1909 now open  
Moved by Mr. J. H. Mitchell and seconded by Mr. Joseph Caldwell  
That Mr. Richard Bell Rees Essa be Warden of the County of Simcoe for the  
year 1909

After waiting 15 minutes the Clerk declared the nominations closed and  
there being no other nomination the Clerk declared Mr. Richard Bell Rees  
of Essa duly elected Warden of the County of Simcoe for the year 1909  
Moved by Mr. G. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Ball and ordered  
That the Council do now adjourn until 3 O'Clock this afternoon to enable  
His Honour Judge Ardagh to hold a special Court to administer the  
declaration of office to the Warden elect.

The Council reassembled at 3 O'Clock when His Honour Judge Ardagh  
held a special Court and administered the declaration of office to the  
Warden elect.

His Honour addressed the Council in his usual eloquent manner  
particularly referring to the work and duties of the Municipal Clerks and  
the unequal manner in which the Municipalities of the County are assessed  
and strongly recommended that all assessments be made according to  
the assessment Act. He finally referred to the retirement of His Honour  
Judge Boys after his long and faithful service of 25 years to the County  
of Simcoe.

The Warden then took the chair and stated that he would defer his inaugural  
address until the evening session.

Ex Wardens D. C. Barr and R. H. Jupp being present in the Chamber they  
were requested to take seats beside the Warden.

The Warden appointed the following members as a Striking Committee
