That the reading of the minutes of the June session of this County Council be dispensed with and that the said minutes as entered on the minute book and printed are hereby declared to be confirmed as the minutes of the said session.
The Warden addressed the Council congratulating the members on their all being present and in a healthy condition he regretted that the few destroyers had dealt heavily with the families of some of our officials in the person of our Treasurer Mr. Dunbar in the loss of two brothers and in the person of Mr. Johnston Recr of Orillia in the loss of two children. He was pleased to state that the terrible war which has been devastating the world for over four years was practically at a close and he suggested that a Thanksgiving service be offered by this County Council to Almighty God for the glorious Victory given to the Allies. He felt proud of the action of the County of Simcoe in the manner in which the young men of the County enlisted to defend the Empire of which we form a part and the generous manner in which the citizens subscribed to all Patriotic purposes.

That this Council is unanimous of expressing their thankfulness to the Almighty for the glorious Victory achieved.

Therefore, be it resolved that this Council do invite the Clergymen of Barrie to meet with us in this Council Chamber tomorrow at 2 p.m. for the purpose of expressing our gratitude to an all wise Providence in granting to man the victory and furthermore that the Warden, Councillors Stewart and Sheehan be a Committee to arrange for same.

At the request of the members of the Council His Honour Judge Vance

addressed the Council in his usual fluent manner expressing his pleasure in the action of the Council in offering Thanksgiving to Almighty God for deliverance from the greatest enemy the Earth ever produced, he instance the action taken by the Parliament of England and was pleased that it was followed by this Council and he would arrange to have the Government officials present and take part in the service.

of the Council which was also attended by several ladies of the Town

The Warden thanked the Municipal Association of Barrie for their kindness in

holding Thanksgiving service in the Council Chamber and assured them that

the words expressed by them in their thankfulness to the Almighty were the

unexpressed thoughts of the members of the Council and that the service would

be an upliftment to all who were present,

At the close of the service a delegation from the Victory Loan Association of

West Simcoe consisting of H.J. Grassett Esq. Wm Bell Esq. H. Stot, Beechcroft Esq. and

W. D. Scott Esq. were introduced when Mr. H.J. Grassett addressed the Council

presenting the County with a beautiful flag which had been presented to them

by the Duke of Devonshire for having considerably gone over their objective

in the 1918 Victory Loan.

The Warden thanked the delegation for their handsome gift and assured

them it would ever be prized by the County Council

The Council resumed its session with the Warden in the chair

The Warden requested ex-Warden W.A. Boys and ex-Mayor being to take seats on the dais

Captain G.C. Cole representing the Navy League of Canada was introduced

when he addressed the Council on behalf of the dependants of the Merchant Marine

showing the great part the Merchant Marine had in winning the war and

the poor remuneration they received for their services leaving them unable to

make any provision for their dependants and as there is no pension in

the Merchant Marine many of their dependants were left in destitute

circumstances and it behoved others to come to the assistance of the

dependants of these brave men

The Navy League of Canada had promised to raise \$6,000,000⁰⁰ for the Merchant

Marine and to obtain this amount they had placed an obligation of 50 units

a head in each County and as Simcoe County had a population of 80,000⁰⁰

they anticipated raising \$4,000,00⁰⁰. Therefrom but as they had not quite

raised \$2,000,00⁰⁰ he asked the Council to make grant of 18,000⁰⁰ to this

most worthy object

Mr. W.A. Boys in a very impressive speech strongly advocated the Council's granting the request of Captain Cole, he went definitely into the great assistance the Merchant Marine was in winning the war in relieving the Allies and in carrying soldiers and munitions to the seat of war. He congratulated the Council on their giving to Patriotic purposes and assured them that the action of the Council has not only been endorsed by the residents of the County but that it has been praised all over the Province and has been an incentive to other Counties to increase their giving, and he believed that in giving the \$18,000⁰⁰ to the Merchant Marine their action would be endorsed by the residents of the County. He spoke of the great difficulty that faced all Municipal Councils in the reconstruction period after the War but he believed the Council of the County of Simcoe would rise up to the difficulty as it has always done in the past.

Ex Mayor Long also spoke in favour of giving a reasonable grant to the Merchant Marine.
