The Warden addressed the Council congratulating the members on their all being present and in a healthy condition he regretted that the great destroyer had dealt heavily with the families of some of our officials in the person of our Treasurer Mr. Leung in the loss of two brothers and in the person of Mr. Johnston Reeve of Ouelles in the loss of two children, He was pleased to state that the terrible war which has been devastating the world for over four years was practically at a close and he suggested that a thanksgiving service be offered by this County Council to Almighty God for the glorious victory given to the Allies, He felt proud of the action of the County of Simcoe in the manner in which the young men of the County enlisted to defend the Empire of which we form a part and the generous manner in which the citizens subscribed to all Patriotic purposes

Moved by Mr. Branting and seconded by Mr. Fleming and ordered that the Council is desirous of expressing their thankfulness to the Almighty for the glorious victory achieved

Therefore be it resolved that this Council do invite the Clergyman of Barrie to meet with us in this Council Chamber tomorrow at 2 pm for the purpose of expressing our gratitude to an all wise Providence in granting to our arms the victory and further that the Warden, Councillors Stewart and Sheehan be a Committee to arrange for same

At the request of the members of the Council His Honour Judge James



addressed the Council in his usual fluent manner expressing his pleasure in the action of the Council in offering thanksgiving to Almighty God for deliverance from the greatest enemy the earth ever produced, he instanced the action taken by the Parliament of England and was pleased that it was followed by this Council and he would arrange to have the Government Officers present and take part in the service

The Council adjourned for the purpose of holding Thanksgiving service to  
 Almighty God for the Glorious Victory granted to the Allies in the terrible war  
 which has been devastating the world for over four years, under the auspices  
 of the Municipal Association of the Town of Barrie when the following Clergymen  
 took part in divine service, The Rev. Wm. Hipkin, President of the Association  
 Rev. H. Moore, Rev. Geo. Brown, Rev. H.D. Raymond and the Rev. P. Dallas when a  
 very solemn and impressive service was held, Judge Vance, Judge Womersley  
 and the other Government and County officials attended the service with the members  
 of the Council which was also attended by several Ladies of the Town

The Warden thanked the Municipal Association of Barrie for their kindness in  
 holding Thanksgiving service in the Council Chamber and assured them that  
 the words expressed by them in their thankfulness to the Almighty were the  
 unexpressed thoughts of the members of the Council and that the service would  
 be an upliftment to all who were present.

At the close of the service a deputation from the Victory Loan Association of  
 West Simcoe consisting of H. J. Grassie, Eng. W. J. Bell, Eng. H. B. Prescott, Eng. and  
 W. P. South, Eng. were introduced when Mr. H. J. Grassie addressed the Council  
 presenting the County with a beautiful flag which had been presented to them  
 by the Duke of Devonshire for having considerably gone over their objective  
 in the 1918 Victory Loan.

The Warden thanked the deputation for their handsome gift and assured  
 them it would ever be prized by the County Council.

The Council resumed its session with the Warden in the chair.

The Warden requested ex Warden W. A. Boys and Ex Mayor Craig to take seats on the dais  
 Captain G. C. Cole representing the Navy League of Canada was introduced  
 when he addressed the Council on behalf of the dependants of the Mercantile Marine  
 showing the great part the Mercantile Marine had in winning the war and  
 the poor remuneration they received for their services leaving them unable to  
 make any provision for their dependants and as there is no pension <sup>fund</sup> in  
 the Mercantile Marine many of their dependants were left in destitute  
 circumstances and it behooved others to come to the assistance of the  
 dependants of these brave men.

The Navy League of Canada had promised to raise \$4,000,000 for the Mercantile  
 Marine and to obtain this amount they had placed an obligation of 50 cents  
 a head in each County and as Simcoe County had a population of 80,000,  
 they anticipated raising \$40,000. Therefore but as they had not quite  
 raised 22,000.00 he asked the Council to make grant of 18,000.00 to this  
 most worthy object.

Mr. W. A. Boys in a very impressive speech strongly advocated the Council  
 granting the request of Captain Cole, he went definitely into the great assistance  
 the Mercantile Marine was in winning the war in including the Allies and  
 in carrying soldiers and munitions to the seat of war, he congratulated the Council  
 on their giving to Patriotic purposes and assured them that the action of the  
 Council has not only been endorsed by the residents of the County but that it  
 has been praised all over the Province and has been an incentive to other  
 Counties to increase their giving, and he believed that in giving the \$18,000.00  
 to the Mercantile Marine their action would be endorsed by the residents of the County.  
 He spoke of the great difficulty that faced all Municipal Councils in the reconstruction  
 period after the war but he believed the Council of the County of Simcoe would rise  
 up to the difficulty as it has always done in the past.

Ex Mayor Craig also spoke in favour of giving a reasonable grant to the  
 Mercantile Marine.

The Warden thanked the speakers and assured them he was heartily in  
 sympathy with the Mercantile Marine and that he was satisfied that  
 the Council would take their request into their serious consideration.
