He went into the matter fully showing the great advantage to Canada in having a Mercantile Marine manned by native Canadians, he stated that although Canada was only a young country she ranked sixth in the Mercantile Marine tonnages of the world and that the future prosperity of Canada depended largely upon its shipping facilities but that this cannot be done as it should be without money and unfortunately there is no Government provision for the education of sailors or the maintenance of the dependents of sailors who lost their lives while following their vocation as sailors and this was the work the Canadian Navy League were endeavouring to carry out but to do so required money and they therefore asked the Council to give them a suitable grant to assist them in their work  
He was followed by the Rev. Mr. Hopkins in a spirited address who strongly advocated a liberal grant to the League for the purpose of carrying on their most laudable work  
The Warden assured the gentleman that their request would receive the serious consideration of the Council
