Accompanying resolution, That in view of the enormous financial engagements Federal, Provincial, Municipal and personal of the Canadian people which now exists, all of which must be met by those concerned, and which are now unduly oppressive, the greatest economy should be practiced by Federal, Provincial and Municipal bodies and by the people, and that expenditures by all governing bodies only should be for the purpose of meeting cases of the most pressing nature having bearing on their side the merit of necessity and future prospects for the betterment of the Country as a whole or to as great an extent as possible.

That past experience has shown that in many cases injudicious undertakings have been commenced (and which having been commenced ^{often} of necessity had to be completed) as to which had more engineering and mature investigation been had before their commencement and less regard paid to local and political exigencies the same would not have been undertaken.

That experience has taught that many propositions of Federal Provincial and Municipal bodies have been undertaken without due scientific and business investigation as to their final cost and as a result the same has vastly exceeded the amounts originally contemplated to be expended thereon.

That all proposed or contemplated undertakings by Federal Provincial or Municipal bodies should (in view of the onerous different taxes now existing and required to be paid by the general public and the conceded failures in some cases and the excessive cost in others of propositions so undertaken as aforesaid) be most closely investigated from a scientific and business point of view and thereafter maturely weighed and in the undertaking of feasible propositions (so dealt with as aforesaid) regard only should be had to works to the general good or to as great an extent as possible for the general good and regard should not be had to sectional personal or political interests.

That having regard to the foregoing that the agitation now being conducted or carried on from various sources, Foreign Federal Provincial Municipal and personal in favor of the so called, "St. Lawrence Deep Waterways and Hydro Power Scheme" on the score of bettering the trade of Canada and the development of electrical energy at an estimated cost of \$250,000,000⁰⁰ does not commend itself to this Honourable body as being so far as shown necessary or requisite and in view of the fact that the report of the Canadian Commission on Waterways "has not yet been generally made known so as to afford the public of Canada a thorough and intelligent insight into the proposition, the Federal Government should not proceed by expenditures in any way beyond those now incurred (save for printing and distribution of the said report) until such said report has been submitted to Parliament with all information obtainable for the approval or rejection of the proposed plan by the Federal Parliament
