At the request of the Warden Mr W.A. Bogg M.P.P. addressed the Council and remarked on the change of the personnel of the Council since his term as Warden in 1907. Only 2 of the present members were here at that time. He referred to the presentation of the Photograph of the late Treasurer, Mr Daniel Dunleavy. He had known him from boyhood and was satisfied the County never had a more capable conscientious or efficient official. Of very even temperament always the same under all conditions and through his long service and wide experience he saved the Council many dollars by his sound advice. In 1901 Colman the County had secured a capable successor and was pleased to know that Mr Jos Gardiner was appointed Governor of the House of Refuge.

He spoke of the threatened legal action arising out of an automobile accident in the Township of Oro at Raithes Crossing on the ridge road which was of great importance from a judicial viewpoint for it involved the question of what might be the necessary width of roadway and what was meant by its term sufficient paving. He would discuss the matter more fully before the Committee.

Mr L.E. Wright M.P.P. in addressing the Council recalled the time he was elected Warden in 1901. Two extraordinary circumstances occurred at that time. He was elected Warden by acclamation and although elected under the reign of Queen Victoria, the oath of office was taken under the reign of King Edward VII. Queen Victoria having died in the meantime thus fulfilling the old saying "The King is dead long live the King." He was glad to see his old colleague Mr Wellington Fisher of Orillia a member of the present Council. He spoke of the County Commissioner as being unsatisfactory for he, in representing the Town of Penetanguishene and the Townships of Tiny & Goshen had to discriminate against one or the other. He also was a fellow member of the late Daniel Dunleavy and was placed under the tutelage of the late County Clerk, Col Banting.

As a member of the Legislature he would be pleased to assist the County Council in every possible way.

And whereas the Penetanguishene Road leading from
the Town of Barrie to the Town of Penetanguishene
is one of the oldest and most travelled roads in the
Province of Ontario and it is desirable that it should
be taken over by the Province and established as a
Provincial Highway.

Therefore the Council of the County of Simcoe
resolves as follows:

1. That the County of Simcoe recommend the
Government of the Province of Ontario to take over that
portion of the Penetanguishene Road leading northward
from the present Provincial Highway at Crown Hill to
the side road between lots number one hundred & ten
and one hundred and eleven in the first Concession
of the Township of Tiny.

2. The County Council desire to represent to the
Government the fact that the said road is the main
thoroughfare leading through the County of Simcoe
and its terminus are situated in the Town of Midland
and Penetanguishene and the Villages of Port McNeill
and Victoria Harbor being the terminus of three

separate Railway systems and having a population of
approximately 15,000 and at these points the traffic on the
Georgian Bay is centered.

3. The County Council hereby appoint a deputation to wait on
the Government to urge the above works consisting of the
following:-

Committee and the following.
