County of Simcoe.

FIRST DAY

Council Chamber, Barrie.
November 24th, 1930.

The Council met pursuant to the adjournment at the June Session.

The Warden in the Chair.

All the Members present. *But Councillor Aselin*

The Minutes of the last general Session were taken as read, and the minutes of the Special Session, held in September, were read and adopted.

The Warden addressed the Council and referred to the death of the late Warden.

He asked the Chairmen of the different Committees to exercise the strictest economy in the giving of grants, although the crops throughout the County were very good this year, the prices were very low and the farmers found it very difficult to meet their obligations.

There was much unemployment, but for the present it was fairly well cared for, but there would be considerable hardship during the winter.

He had a trip over the County roads with the County Road Committee and the County Engineer. All the roads were in extra good condition and the County should be congratulated on the state they were in.

He had been asked about the condition of the finances of the County, and he wished to say that the County Treasurer would make a report during the Session.
