FIRST DAY

Council chamber, Barrie, June 11th, 1934.

The Council met pursuant to the adjournment at the January Session.

The Warden in the chair

The Warden addressed the Council and welcomed the members and was pleased all were able to attend the Session.

He reported that the County Road Committee had visited Mr. Isaac Scott, last year's warden, and he expressed the hope that he would again be able to visit the Council.

He referred to the death of Mr. F.W. Fenton, Port McNicoll, and Mr. Geo. Sinclair, Grillia, former members of the Council, stating that their passing was a loss to the County and particularly to their own municipalities.

The severe winter had caused great loss to the farmers in the County, practically all the fall wheat and clover had been winterkilled and pastures had been very short. The recent rain was very welcome and would make rapid growth, and he trusted a satisfactory harvest would be reached.

The financial position of many of the municipalities had been greatly improved.

They had been able to collect arrears of taxes and considerable amounts of arrears of County levies had been paid.
