OF THE JUNE SESSION, 1941, OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF SIMCOE

FIRST DAY

Council Chamber, Barrie, June 16th, 1941.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment at the January Session. The Warden in the Chair.

All the members were present.

The Minutes of the January Session of the Council having been printed and distributed were taken as read.

The Warden addressed the Council and welcomed them to the June Session. Since the January Session Councillor O'Leary, Reeve of Adjala, had been appointed Clerk of the township and Mr. W. H. Fatterson had been appointed Reeve. Mr. Patterson had presented his certificate of election and declaration of office; the Warden expressed his pleasure in welcoming him to the Council.

He stated that the long period of dry weather had caused a lot of anxiety among the farmers and others; crops had ceased growing and, in many places, were drying up. The recent rain was a God-send and the rural members could attend Council and have the satisfaction of knowing their crops were growing. Indirectly, the rain was a benefit to the towns and villages as well.

He said that the County Road system, together with all Township and Provincial roads, suffered a lot when the frost was coming out this spring; not for many seasons were they in such bad condition, and it required a lot of work and expense to repair them and put them in a safe condition for travel. Consequently, there is not much of the County Appropriation left for the County roads for the remainder of the year; the Council might consider providing more money for the County Road System.

The Warden reminded the Council of the graveness of the war situation and recommended that all the members support the Victory Loan and do everything in their power to aid in prosecuting the war.

He stated that the financial condition of the County continued to show improvement; many municipalities had paid their County levy for 1941 and at the present time the County had no borrowings from the bank. The County Treasurer reported a balance there of \$15,000.00.

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He requested the members to give their best consideration to the important matters that were coming before the Council and urged them to be prompt in attendance at Sessions and Committee Meetings.

That Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars, over and above the funds made available by the ordinary road levy, be placed at the disposal of the Road Committee, the same to be transferred from the General funds to the Road Account as required during the year; owing to the large expenditure required for snow removal and to the extensive damage incurred to road surfaces in the early spring necessitating the expenditure of a considerable sum for resurfacing in order to restore the surfaces of the roads to their original condition, it is urgent that this additional sum for road purposes be provided.

Councillor Toner explained that if there were not more money granted to the County Road System, the roads could not be maintained at their present status.

June 16, 1941.

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The Highway Department had approved of an expenditure of \$140,000 and this additional amount would not interfere with the County By-law.

After some discussion the Warden invited Mr. E. W. Jones, County Road Superintendent, to address the Council. Commended Mr. Jones stated that for some years the County Road Committee could have expended more money to good advantage. Last winter, much more money than formerly, was required for snow ploughing, and the County Road Committee had authorized the expenditure of approximately \$8,000 for a new Grader with snow plough attachment. He strongly recommended the extra appropriation.

The Motion was put and declared carried.

Moved by Councillor Dutton, seconded by Councillor Benson, and ordered, That the Council do now adjourn until Tuesday, at 10 A.M., Standard Time.

SECOND DAY

Council Chamber, Barrie, June 17, 1941.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment from yesterday's session. The Warden in the chair.

All the members were present but Councillor Irwin.

The Minutes of the previous session were read and adopted.

The Warden presented the following communications and accounts:

Assessment Notice of Reforestry properties purchased by the County in the Township of Tossorontic for Reforestation purposes.

A. E. Wilson & Co. Ltd., re Fire Alarm System in the House of Refuge at Beeton.

J. N. Bourrie, President of the Collingwood Board of Trade, re improvement of County Road across Concessions 1 and 2, Nottawasaga Twp. (Byrnes Avenue).

County Treasurer Coleman presented Councillor Dutton with a photograph of the Council of 1915.

Lieut. Col. McDonald, O. C. the 2nd Battalion Grey & Simcoe Foresters, appeared before the Council with reference to assistance to the battalion. He stated that conditions had changed greatly since he appeared before the Council some years ago. He was requesting assistance for both the 1st and 2nd battalions of the Grey & Simcoe Foresters which were considered as one regiment. He asked for an appropriation of \$1,500 to be divided, \$1,000 to the 1st battalion, and \$500 to the 2nd battalion. The money was needed and would be expended for regimental purposes; he trusted that another appeal would not have to be made this year. The County of Grey Council had made a similar Grant.

Major Clarke, Orillia, supported the request of Col. McDonald. He stated that if the Orillia company had to go to Collingwood for rifle practice at the Rifle Ranges there there was no provision for transportation and a Grant would be applied for such purposes.

Lieut. Marron said he was the Colonel's mouthpiece and the Colonel spoke for both.

Lieut. Col. McDonald, in speaking again, referred to the organization meeting held in the Council Chamber some three or four weeks ago. He stated that Recruiting Committees had been appointed in various municipalities in the County but,

at the meeting referred to, the matter of appointing a Central Committee had been overlooked. He asked the Council, while in Session, to consider the appointment of such a Central Committee.

Mr. George H. Carson addressed the Council on the question of the installation of an Automatic Fire Alarm System in the House of Refuge. He referred to the loss of life in property where fires were not discovered in time and stated that his system was giving satisfaction wherever installed. He asked the Council to give careful consideration to the installing of this system in the Simcoe County Home as a protection for the Governor and the old people.

The Warden assured Mr. Carson that this matter would be carefully considered by the Council.

That the Equalization Committee consider the advisability of reducing the equalized assessment of the Township of Tecumseth to the amount of \$4,500 being the assessment on the County property, owned by the County for the House of Refuge purposes, known as the Riddell property.

Mr. Ghas. Lovering, ex-Reeve of Matchedash, addressed the Council and expressed his satisfaction at hearing the Council had voted \$1500 to the Grey & Simcoe Foresters Regiment. He stated that our soldiers are worthy and deserving of support and we would be called upon to pay larger amounts later on. He was informed that a petition had been presented to the Council requesting the lowering of the North River bridge on the boundary between the Townships of Matchedash and Tay. He expressed the wish that his name be put on record as being definitely opposed to the lowering of this bridge.

Mr. M. V. Lovering, R.R.#1 Coldwater, appeared before the Council and stated he had an accident on the North River bridge on the County Read between the Townships of Tay and Matchedash. He had notified the County of his accident and was advised that it had been sent to the Highway Insurance Co. with when the County carried a Highway Insurance Policy. It was May 19, more than three months after the accident, that an investigation was made; the Insurance Co. then refused to admit liability, and when he went to enter suit he was told that he should have taken action within three months from the date of the accident. He asked the County to pay him the amount of his repair costs -- \$23.00.

Mr. E. W. Jones, County Read Superintendent, stated to the Council that in the last three years he had received offers for three positions at a salary larger than he is receiving from the County. He had practically decided to tender his resignation as County Read Superintendent but was persuaded by the County Read Committee to withold it for the present. He said he enjoyed his work in the County and was pleased that he was getting results and had received such splendid co-operation from the Council.

Counciller Borrow asked if it was the intention of the County Read Committee to remeve any rock this season on County Road No. 17. Councillor Tener. Chairman of the County Road Committee, replied that this question would be considered when future appropriations were made for expenditure on the County Reads this year.

Mr. E. W. Jones, County Road Superintendent, expressed his appreciation of the action taken by the Council and informed the members that he much preferred to stay in Simcoe County, and when the vote was unanimous asking him to stay, he could not do anything else but accept.

Councillor Horne asked for a report on the T.B. testing of cattle in Orillia Township. He was informed by Counciller Borrow that he would have the information for to-morrow's Session.

June 19th. 1941.

Mr. Booth, organizer for the Victory Lean Campaign, addressed the Council on the subject of the Loan in Simcoe County and asked the Council if they would consider the purchasing of Victory Bonds by the County.

Councillor Brack stated that the Council of his township had been asked to invest \$4000 or \$5000 in Victory Bonds; he asked if bonds, purchased by the township, could be cashed any time after six months. He was assured that the banks were instructed to purchase any such bonds offered for sale.

The Warden assured the deputation that their request would receive the earnest consideration of the Council.

Ex-Warden Stewart being in the Chamber the Warden invited him to have a seat on the dias. Mr. Stewart stated that a feeling of loneliness prompted him to visit the Cauncil when it was in Session. In discussing the authority of Municipal Councils to invest in Victory Bonds, he was of the opinion that if a municipality had a Sinking Fund or a surplus in the bank it would be allowable for the Council to purchase bonds; otherwise, he would not recommend their purchase by a municipality.

Moved by Counciller Evans, seconded by Counciller Grant Miller, and ordered.

That leave be granted to introduce a By-law to previde for the raising of the sum of \$57,710.02 on that part of the County outside of High and Continuation School Districts for the cost of the education of County pupils attending the various schools and to raise the sum of \$1,251.92 on the whole rateable property of the County for Vocational School purposes, and that the necessary By-law herewith presented be read a first time.

Treasurer or the Treasurer of the Municipality, as the case may require, shall return to the Clerk of the Municipality on or before the 15th day of September an account of all arrears of taxes due in respect of occupied lands or lands built upon, including the percentage chargeable under Section 147 of the said Act. And the Clerk of the Municipality shall make out a collector's roll for the year, adding such arrears of taxes to the taxes assessed against such lands for the current year, and such arreard shall be collected in the same manner and subject to the same conditions as all other taxes entered upon the collector's roll.

AND WHEREAS this Council is of the opinion that the said arrears should not be so entered on the collector's roll as it involves considerable difficulty in collecting penalties theren and a further difficulty in allowing a discount for prepayment of current taxes and in several instances has resulted in considerable loss in the collection of penalties and the allowance of discount.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Corporation of the County of Sincee that the Legislature of the Province of Ontario be asked to amend said Section 136, Sub-sections 1 and 2 to provide that at the option of Municipalities the said arrears of taxes need not be entered on the Collector's roll and if not so entered that the arrears be collected in the usual way by the County Treasurer or the Clerk of the local Municipality as the case may be, and that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Department of Municipal Affairs.
