After having waited fifteen minutes the Clerk declared the nominations
closed and proceeded to take the vote on the candidates standing for
election namely E. J. Lodd Reeve of Innisfil, James Dundas Reeve
of Essa and J. C. Jamieson Reeve of Watawasaga when E. J. Lodd
Reeve of Innisfil received a majority vote of the Council the Clerk
declared him duly elected Warden of the County of Simcoe for the year
1919

His Honour Judge Vance held a special Court and administered the
oath of office to the Warden elect.

The Warden then took the chair

His Honour Judge Vance addressed the Council in his usual pleasant manner
He stated that this was the second time he addressed the Council under Peace
conditions the first being in January 1914 and fortunately this year but
although we have peace there is strenuous times before the world but he
hoped that the strong men who brought us out of the difficulties of the
past four years would be able to overcome the present difficulties. He
referred to the remarks he made the first time he addressed this Council
when he spoke of the scientific manner the Germans conducted the
affairs of their country this of course was before the war, but he had
no apology to make as they carried the same scientific procedure
throughout the war but they had no soul no morals for the moment
they got into difficulties they succumbed. It was different with the allies
the greater difficulties they got into the greater efforts they made for they
were fighting in a righteous cause for liberty and right where as the
the Germans were fighting to rule the world and the want of soul
lost them the war

his appropriate address to the members of the Council

The Warden addressed the Council thanking the members for the high honor
they had conferred upon him in electing him Warden of the County of Simcoe
a County that has taken ~~the~~ second place to no other County in the Dominion
in the manner in which the citizens therein have upheld the Empire during
the past four years. It has given many of its best young men and it is beyond
comprehension the amount of money that has been expended for war purposes
not only by the County Council but by all the citizens therein. It is hard to mention
or thank anyone particularly when all the citizens were doing their level best
but he could not let this opportunity pass without thanking the ladies of the
County for the great work achieved by them in the Red Cross, Field Comforts
and the Cooking Kitchen which work went along way towards winning the war
Referring to the soldiers who will return to us he claimed that it behooved
us to do our best for them and show by our actions that we appreciate
their sacrifices and for those who have given their lives for us we should
honour them by build some memorial in their honour. He suggested
that the Council should take into their consideration some improvement
to the Court House as it is hardly in keeping with the standing of the
great County
